We have seen him restore broken relationships. We have lived inside a community of acceptance and accountability, of affection and consequences. We walk day by day in the power of the One who lives inside us to make us our true and best selves. We have enjoyed the transformation of healthy coping skills like two-way prayer, Scripture meditation, worship, communion, and friendship. Slowly over time, love heals us from the inside out.

The night before his murder, Jesus said these words to his apprentices. "I've loved you the way my Father has loved me. Make yourselves at home in my love. ... Love one another the way I loved you" (John 15:9-12, *The Message*). Breathtaking and beautiful! Jesus loves us the exact same way and with the exact same intensity of the Father's love for him. As William Paul Young wrote in *The Shack*, "God is especially fond of you!" When we live inside that love, then we are forgiven, healed, and restored. Love wins! Then we can love one another with fierce, tender, caring, compassionate, wise, generous love. As we live in relationships of true love, everything else falls into place. How could I know this love, and withhold it from others? From the mothers and children we serve? It simply must be shared.
